


## Plant-Based Barnet Campaign

- 1. Make a commitment that any catering at future council events and meetings will be 100% plant-based.
- 2. Increase the number of plant-based meal options in schools (where this is council managed), or insist catering suppliers offer more plant-based food (if outsourced).
- 3. Promote & encourage plant-based eating to residents in any way available to the council.

### The opportunity

- 74% of councils across the UK (including Barnet since May) have declared a climate emergency (300+ out of 404) this is the logical & necessary next step!
- A commitment to plant-based shows that Barnet is serious about its climate responsibilities
- Just one or two successes could ignite a wave of change across the country domino effect
- There is precedent: some councils are doing it by themselves without any pressure

# Why?

- A 2018 **Oxford University** study stated that the 'single biggest change' we can all make to reduce our environmental impact is to adopt a plant-based diet.
- Last summer's **National Food Strategy**, led by Henry Dimbleby, concluded a **30**% reduction in meat consumption is required to help food security for future generations.
- **Sir David Attenborough:** "We must reduce our meat & dairy consumption for the sake of the planet" The planet "simply cannot sustain billions of meat eaters"
- Barnet becoming 100% plant-based has a big impact and is low effort and cost
- We need to normalise vegan diets

- **Enfield** (July 2020) Stopped serving meat at all council meetings & events.
- **Reading** (Nov 2021) The mayor of Reading has said that all food served at mayoral functions during her tenure will be vegan or vegetarian

# How are we going to do it? In a nutshell....

- First, we <u>write to councillors</u> and decision makers, trying to engage them with our proposal and relevant facts. We send a brief, friendly reminder after one week to those who don't reply.
- We continue dialogue with the councillors who respond positively.

### The situation in Barnet

- I've written to all 41 Labour councillors
- 12 responses, 4 positive & 8 neutral
- Most supportive councillors:
  - O Andreas Ioannidis Colindale North Ward said he would vote for a plant-based motion
  - Rishikesh Chakraborty West Hendon Ward asked council employees if this could be part of climate
     action plan
  - Or Simon Radford East Barnet Ward said he would speak to chair of environment committee about passing a plant-based motion
- 21st Nov Barnet Environment and Climate Change Committee meeting
